Grants

In 2022 the Foundation launched an Educational Grant Program. The applications were open to institutions and instructors directly engaged in Graphic Communication, Visual and Design Technology and Print-centric educational programs. These include high schools, trade schools, junior and community college associate programs, four-year colleges, and universities, along with Masters and Doctorate Degree programs.

A budget of \$100,000 was established to fund requests that supported furthering students' education and exposure to print, packaging, and related industries. The Grant review committee is comprised of PGSF board members—they evaluate, score, and review each request.

Thanks to your sponsorship, our 2023 Phoenix Challenge Team was able to travel to the FTA FORUM/INFOFLEX event in Columbus, Ohio and compete in the college competition. Our CPCC team took home the Excellence in Execution Award for our efforts. We also had the opportunity to meet numerous faces of flexography and print, which will help us to become employed in the industry.

Madison, Martin, My, Zach, Jose & Lacy Central Piedmont Community College Graphic Arts and Imaging Technology Students Over \$83,000 was awarded to 20 different institutions and instructors. These funds were used in a variety of ways, including equipment purchases and student travel expenses to attend print-related competitions and off-campus course offerings.

We continue to expose students to print production and technologies. We are thankful for the provided funds to purchase a Glowforge 3D Laser Printer in 2022.

Contests

In an effort to continue to raise awareness and engagement with educators, institutions and their students, PGSF has annual design contests.

The 2022 Poster Design Contest asked participants to promote the 2023-2024 call for scholarship applications. There were two versions—one focused on full-time students, the second inviting part-time students to apply. Students with winning designs were awarded \$500 each and received press coverage and printed copies of their submissions. Produced posters and t-shirts were distributed into many schools, at trade shows, and on digital channels.


